Advertisement/ Addenda	<ul> <li>Changing the solicitation criteria to favor a particular proponent is a red flag of potential bid rigging (International Anti-Corruption Resource Center).</li> <li>Too many addenda could indicate unclear specifications or unclear scope of work, which could also favor a particular proponent.</li> </ul>	DOP published more than two addenda during this solicitation. Responsive Review	<ul> <li>DOP procedures require findings to be recorded on a responsive checklist which identifies specific submittal requirements for the project and identifies a bidder's compliance with those required documents.</li> <li>Unclear or inconsistent responsiveness determinations could be a red flag of bid manipulation.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>DOP deemed two of five bidders responsive but IPRO noted deficiencies in each of the bids:</li> <li>One bidder's submission had missing or incomplete documents including no joint venture agreement and an incomplete safety record form.</li> <li>The other bidder's joint venture agreement was not notarized as required.</li> </ul>	No response needed.

Cancellation	<ul> <li>The Government Accountability Office states that the use of standard language such as "in the best interest of the city" without a specific justification for cancellation could be a fraud indicator.</li> <li>Transparency International states that effective record-keeping of decisions and reasons for cancellation promotes accountability and transparency.</li> </ul>	The user department cancelled the solicitation during the current period because the bids exceeded the project budget.
